A strong entry of weaned calves met a very firm trade. Fair to say a few were bordering on the older side for this section but plenty of interest and all were well sold. Another grand entry of 60 Blue and Angus steers and heifers from Mark Peters, Sussex commanded brisk bidding. His 7 – 8mo Blue steers topped at £690 and heifers at £635. Buyers wanting the best Continentals and prepared to pay for the right goods. Angus were wanted with some super types again from Mark Peters saw best steers to £605 and heifers to £542. Leaner sorts generally £400 - £480. High House Farms of Dorchester presented a large run of Angus and Stabiliser steers and heifers; these hard out grazing cattle saw good interest throughout. 





FRIESIAN

Very limited entries of Friesians through the ring this week but a very tidy trade for those on offer. Nice types from Yeatman Partners to £628. A few well grown free martin older heifers saw lively bidding as British Friesians again from Yeatman Partners to £1005 and 25mo heifers to £1190 from TC Cox, Puddletown. More nice 14-18mo sorts could have been well sold.
