

Another excellent annual consignment from young farmers Katie Ferrett & Josh Howden who saw their 50 (10-11mo) suckled steers and heifers produce tremendous bidding. Their Simmental steers easily to £970 while heifers at £840.

Phil Samways was well rewarded for making the trip from Swanage, as always presenting some of the top Simmentals as his homebred suckled steers 12mo peaked at £1278, £1100 and heifers to £1040. Very few younger Dairy bred Continental but all those with good conformation were wanted.

ANGUS

Quite amazing entries of Angus which today made up 50% of the total number on offer. RF Stratton again showing us wonderful support as they were forward with their annual run of 95 superb Angus steers and heifers (12mo). All were homebred and straight off the Deverill hills out of Friesian types. Buyers were very keen to purchase these grand cattle which saw pens of steers realise £998, £865 and £825 and heifers to £742, £710 and £660. Best quality single suckled steers 13mo from MA Wills commanded top bidding at £1030. Grand strong forward steers were in abundance with top spot to Tim & Paul Wilkinson to £1550, closely followed by J Trott & Sons at £1445. 

CLIMATE

- More carbon is stored and/or sequestered
- · Flood risk is reduced
- Farmers, land managers and the public better understand what different habitats and land uses can store carbon and reduce carbon emissions
- The landscape is more resilient to climate change



PEOPLE

- There are more opportunities for people to explore, enjoy and understand the landscape
- There are more opportunities for more diverse audiences to explore, enjoy and understand the landscape
- There is greater public engagement in land management, such as through volunteering
- Farmers and land managers feel increasingly comfortable with providing public goods



NATURE

- There is a greater area of habitat improved for biodiversity
- There is an increase in biodiversity
- There is greater connectivity between habitats
- Existing habitat is better managed



PLACE

- The quality and character of the landscape is reinforced or enhanced
- Historic structures and features are conserved, enhanced or interpreted more effectively
- There is an increase in farm business resilience (you must deliver this equally balanced with other outcomes)

Applications for over £10,000 will be judged by a Local Assessment Panel. The Panel of 8 to 12 people includes representatives from Cranborne Chase AONB, Natural England and the farming and land management community as well as local specialists. The panel meets every 6 to 8 weeks. Applications for less than £10,000 are decided upon by a senior member of the AONB team (who has no prior knowledge of the project). All projects are to be completed by 31st March 2025.

Quotes must be received for each element of work in every application where Countryside Stewardship rates or rates from other agricultural support streams do not apply.
