IMPORTANT CHANGES TO LEGISLATION – PLEASE READ

VETERINARY ATTESTATIONS – EFFECTIVE 13TH DECEMBER 2023

What is Changing?

Changes in EU legislation, as from 13th December 2023, will require all producers selling livestock for slaughter to have had an annual on-farm veterinary visit to allow their animals, and/or part of any animal, to be exported out of the UK. Up until now, a farmer declaration has satisfied the requirements, however from 13th December 2023, producers will require a Veterinary Attestation. This will certify that an annual on-farm visit has taken place to verify the absence of notifiable diseases and provide general advice on farm biosecurity, meeting EU requirements. The Vet will provide the producer with a unique Veterinary Attestation Number, known as a "VAN" within their certificate.

What is the "VAN" number?

The Veterinary Attestation Number, known as "VAN", is a unique reference number provided by Vets to producers within their Veterinary Attestation certificate to certify that an annual on-farm visit has taken place. A VAN number is valid for 12 months. This information will need to be provided to livestock markets, and onwards to buyers, for livestock sold for slaughter. The VAN number is made up of 20 digits as follows, including the Vets RCVS number, the CPH number the VAN corresponds to, and expiry date. For example: 1234567-12/345/6789-0624 [MRCVS number]-[CPH number]-[Valid to the end of June 2024.

What will you need to do?

If you are a member of a <u>qualifying assurance scheme (Red Tractor Assurance)</u> then you do not need to do anything as a <u>VAN number is not required</u>.

If you are **not Farm Assured**, you will need to provide the auctioneers with your VAN number prior to, or on arrival at the market.

For **sheep**, this will be included on an updated official sheep movement form.

For <u>cattle</u>, we will provide an updated cattle entry form to include a place to write your VAN number if necessary.

For <u>pigs</u>, the digital eAML2 form has been updated to accommodate the VAN number. Please note that the above will include <u>Prime</u>, <u>cull and store stock</u> as some forward store stock goes to slaughter from store markets.

We will take a note of your <u>VAN number</u> on our market system and <u>this will be valid for 12</u> <u>months</u>. VAN templates can be collected from the market office or found here:



A good number of store cattle forward again this week however the weather starting to show in some of the cattle with a large percentage of the entry being 'colder' coming in off the grass. Warmer fed types very much in demand with a notable difference between those fed stores. A good number of buyers ringside again ensuring all cattle selling to competition.

COWS & CALVES

Bigger number coming through for this sale and while trade firm the recent weather and easing in the cull cow trade has all had an effect on prices and demand. Those cows with stronger calves continuing to attract good interest but leaner types harder to place. Appuldurcombe Heritage saw their Shorthorn cows and bull calves top at £1240. A good second consignment from BM Heal & Son realised level bidding with nice Hereford cows with 2mo steer calves to £1200 while Blue and Angus 3mo calves sold to £1190. A large consignment of Highland cows & calves saw demand steady generally £800 - £900. Quality in calf Hereford cows to £1100.

GRAZING COWS

These were well in line with the Wednesday trade and saw good firm bidding throughout. Plainer types from £550 - £700 while good thick Simmentals flew to a tremendous £1450. 2y/o Pedigree Angus breeding bull sold to £1390.

YOUNG CONTINENTAL

Buyers selective but paying well for the good well presented types. Super sweet young Charolais suckled calves from Rob & Julian Banwell saw 6-7mo steers at £870 and heifers to £620. Clive House was well rewarded for his homebred top draw 12mo Charolais seeing steers regularly £1225, £1150 and £1095, with heifers from £950 and £860. Dairy x Continentals saw a lot of cattle suffering from the recent hard weather and more difficult to place. Plent of steers 6-10mo ranging £450 - £600 with heifers £400 - £500.

A few more interested parties in the younger Angus today and overall sold well with plenty of steers 8-10mo £660 - £700 and smart types from Rob Phelps 8mo to a grand £780. Cracking steers 14mo from RWH & CA Brown topping at £940. Younger heifers in quite short supply £400 - £500. Stronger Angus setting a brisk trade with more general interest around the ring. Top spot for forward steers went to Denis Higgins at £1432 closely followed by David Green & family at £1305, Alaistair Hammond's Angus x Shorthorn to £1300 and A & G Hardwick to £1225. 
Applications for over £10,000 will be judged by a Local Assessment Panel. The Panel of 8 to 12 people includes representatives from Cranborne Chase AONB, Natural England and the farming and land management community as well as local specialists. The panel meets every 6 to 8 weeks. Applications for less than £10,000 are decided upon by a senior member of the AONB team (who has no prior knowledge of the project). All projects are to be completed by 31st March 2025.

Quotes must be received for each element of work in every application where Countryside Stewardship rates or rates from other agricultural support streams do not apply.
